The vision to reconnect the city centre with the waterfront is underpinned by key design principles that embrace public access, heritage, protected views and open space.

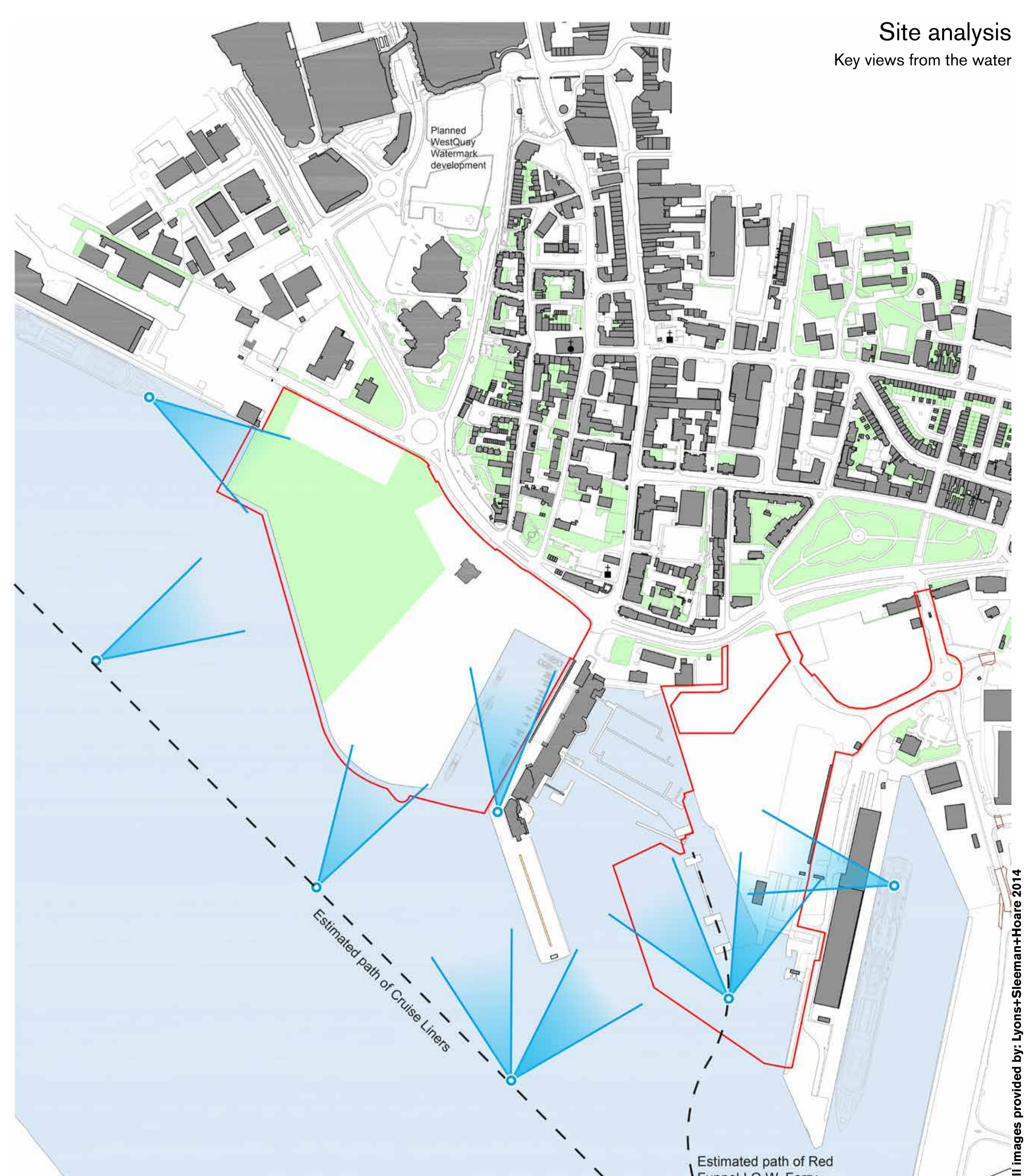
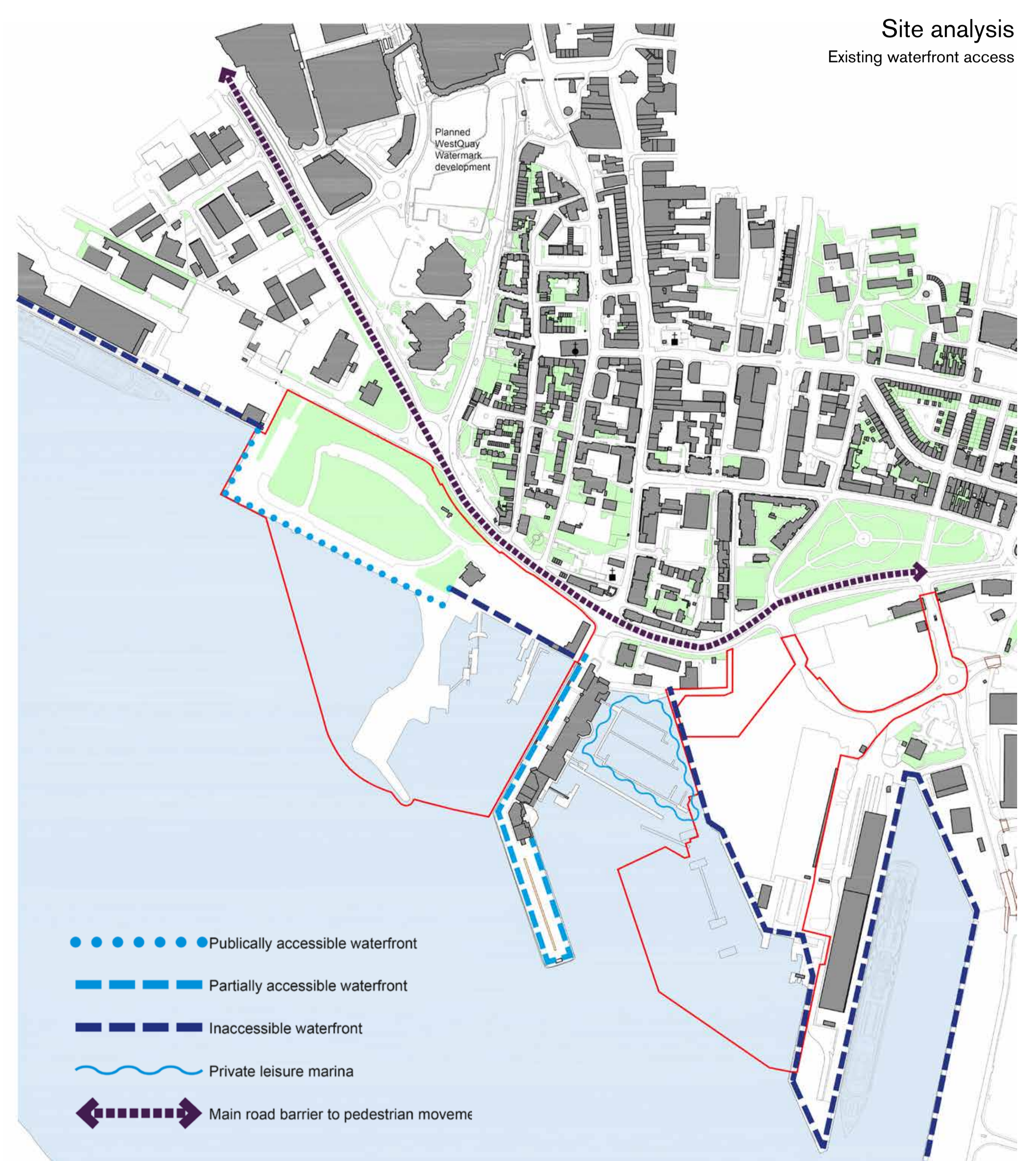
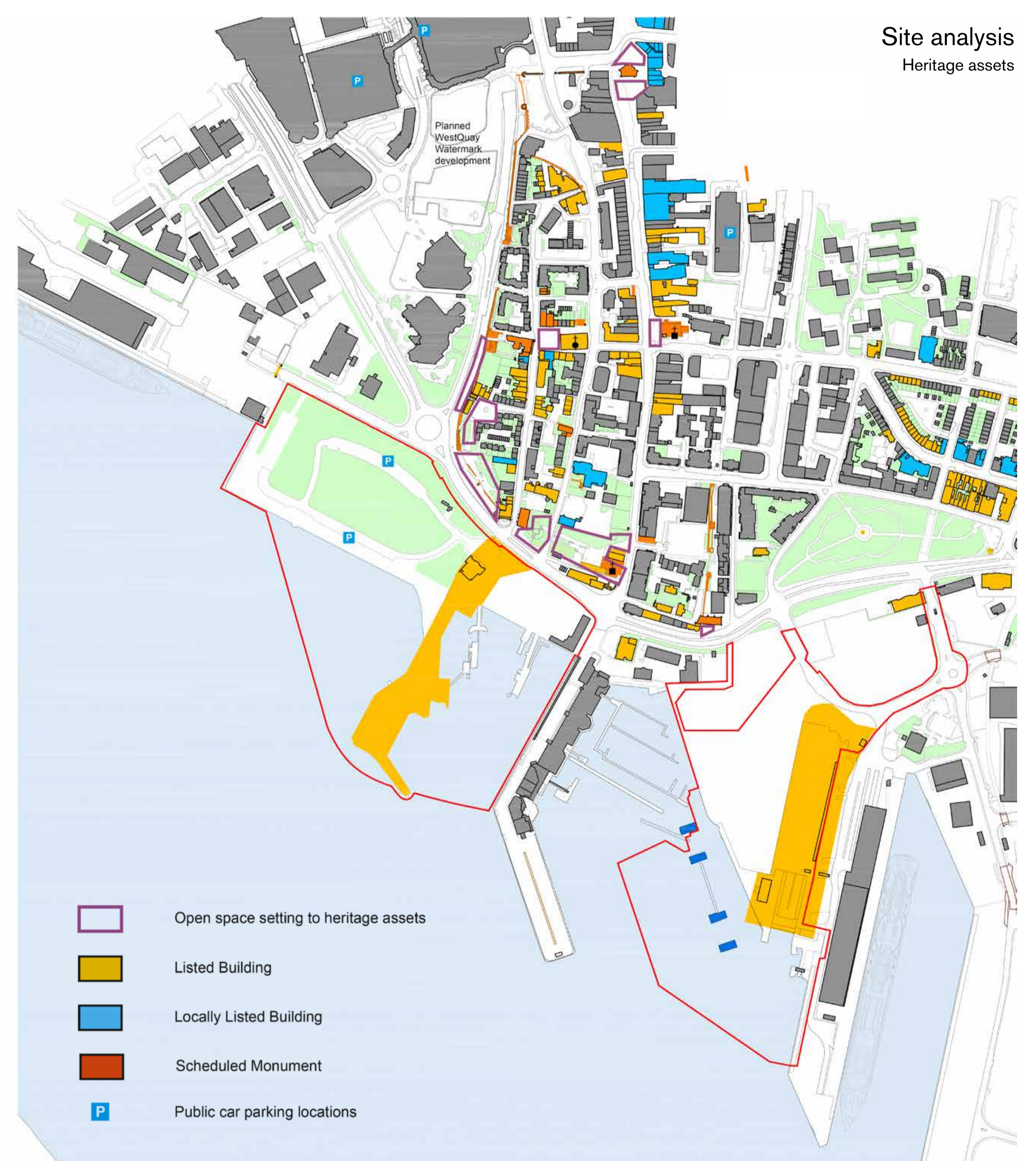

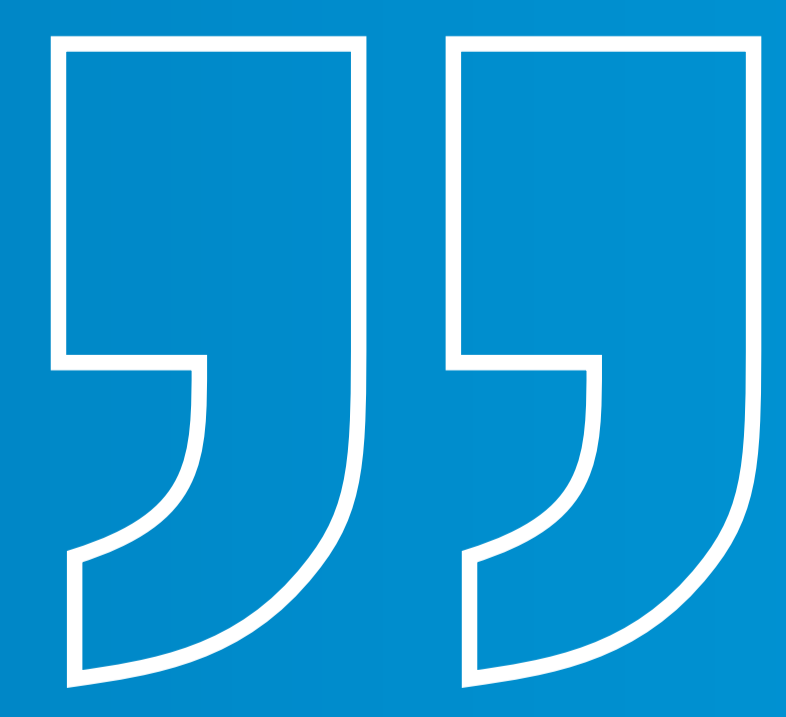
An exciting

The key principles are to:

- Significantly increase public access to and enjoyment of the waterfront
- Reduce the severance caused by Town Quay Road
- Extend and transform Mayflower Park into a contemporary urban park, with new and upgraded play and sports areas and other facilities
- Protect key views from the city towards the water and from the water's edge to key heritage features and buildings
- Create a new marine basin for large yachts, heritage vessels and tall ships, extending the waterfront
- Create a design that is sympathetic and complementary to the heritage features in the vicinity
- Improve cycle, pedestrian and public transport provision.
